We look forward to our next gathering where we can continue to learn from each other and exchange exciting ideas!






News from our Alma Mater

Training a new generation of aspiring actuaries and financial engineers: the MAFE 24-25 cohort


The Master's program in Actuarial and Financial Engineering (MAFE) welcomed 46 (in the English) and 8 (in the Dutch) new students in the program. They started their 2-year training at MSc level in September 2024. Together with the ongoing students the MAFE group now counts 110 students, of which 99 in the English and 11 in the Dutch program.

Below you see the evolution of the MAFE students over the past 5 academic years (source: FEB data management team).






Number of new students joining the English MAFE program



Number of new students joining the Dutch MAFW program






Total number of students in the Dutch MAFW program

Within the MAFE student group, we see a gender imbalance with 75% male and only 25% female students. Still, this evolution is in line with the composition in other quantitative programs.

In terms of group composition, the graph below shows that the program performs well in attracting international students.



Corresponding member Swiss Actuarial Association

During the annual meeting of the Swiss Actuarial Association (Bern, 6-7 September 2024) Katrien Antonio was awarded the title of corresponding member of the Swiss Actuarial Association, based on "achievements as a leader of the actuarial profession and as an innovative contributor to actuarial science". The limited number of <u>corresponding members (only 20)</u> reflects the prestigious nature of this title.

Katrien addressed an acceptance speech entitled 'Responsible actuarial learning' during the assemblée génerale of the association.

PhD Jens Robben completed

On October 2, 2024 Jens Robben successfully defended his PhD thesis entitled "Insights from fine-grained data for actuarial applications in mortality and non-life reserving". Jens has an MSc in Mathematics (2019, KU Leuven) as well as an MSc in Actuarial and Financial Engineering (2020, KU Leuven). He joined the research group in 2020, and is one of the collaborators on the IA|BE mortality projection model. His main research focus is on mortality modelling. We highlight two chapters from his PhD thesis:

• Catastrophe risk in a stochastic multi-population mortality model

This paper, published in the Journal of Risk and Insurance in 2024, combines a decreasing stochastic mortality trend with a regime-switching mechanism that captures age-specific mortality shocks over a lengthy calibration period. As such, a toolbox is developed to incorporate mortality shocks in stochastic mortality projection models. Read the paper <u>here</u>.

• The short-term association between environmental variables and mortality: evidence from Europe. Using fine-grained, publicly available data, this paper studies the short-term association between environmental factors, i.e., weather and air pollution characteristics, and weekly mortality rates in small geographical regions in Europe. Young alumni from the MAFE program know Jens as the teaching assistant for the Loss Models course, a foundation course in the program. In September 2024 Jens joined the Research Center for Longevity Risk, part of the University of Amsterdam, as a postdoc. He continues working on topics related to mortality modelling. Hachemeister prize 2024 awarded to KU Leuven researchers

The Casualty Actuarial Society (CAS) awarded the 2024 edition of the Charles A. Hachemeister prize to the paper "Bridging the gap between pricing and reserving with an occurrence and development model for non-life insurance claims". The paper is the result of a collaboration between A&F member dr. Jonas Crevecoeur, prof. Antonio, A&F member Stijn Desmedt and Alexandre Masquelein.

The paper was published in ASTIN Bulletin in 2023, and puts focus on bridging the tasks of pricing and reserving in non-life insurance. Hereto, an occurrence and development model for non-life claims is developed that tackles reserving and at the same time resolves inconsistencies in traditional pricing methods between actual observations and imputed best estimates of ultimate claim amounts.

The mission statement of this award is as follows "In honor of Charles Hachemeister's passion for connecting ASTIN's primarily European-based membership to challenges faced by CAS members in North America, emphasis in selecting the prize-winning paper will be placed on the paper's impact for North American actuaries and practicality of application."
